Clerk's Report on matters since the Parish Council meeting, 24th September 2024.

1. Cemetery

- i) A burial took place on 10th October 2024 where a horse and carriage transported the deceased to the cemetery. The family kindly updated the village of the possible traffic delays due to the procession.

Revenue due from this service is £300.00

- ii) A member of the public whose three family members are interred at the cemetery contacted the clerk to raise concern and upset that the two headstone memorials appear to have damage caused by the groundworks contractor when he completes his works within the cemetery.

Contact has been made with the contractor; I'm awaiting a response as I had to leave a voice message. A further update will be provided at the Parish Council meeting on 29th October 2024.

3. Golden Garden

- i) Remembrance Sunday Service in the Golden Garden.

Reverend Mark Poskitt is to kindly lead the service at the memorial on Sunday 10th November 2024, commencing at 10.50pm. Ex- serviceman Mr Robert Brown is to complete the reading, and (hopefully) members of the Parish Council will read out the names of the fallen heroes noted on the memorial. I will collect the Poppy Wreath from the British Legion contact at Selby Abbey, as usual. The Order of Service is to be updated with dates and personnel and posters will be placed in the noticeboards. The Community Groups will be contacted to inform them of the service and request they attend where possible.

The P.A. system needs arranging (Cllr Lowes??)

- ii) The existing electricity supply to the Golden Garden is to be disconnected remotely by Northern Power Grid; this service is free of charge as opposed to the physical disconnection which was quoted at a cost of £1200.00

They are to confirm when this has been completed; no electricity costs should then apply for this festive season nor others going forward.

4. Local Matters & Correspondence Received

- i) A Cllr raised an issue with overhanging vegetation along the Trods from the Oddfellows carpark to Camm Lane, which was reported to him recently. A letter of required action can be issued once the owner of the garden is identified.

- ii) Correspondence was received regarding a request for Carlton Parish Council to join in the petition to reduce speeding in villages and request more speed camera usage. This was emailed out to the Councillors prior to the meeting.
