Clerk's Report on matters since the Parish Council meeting held 30th September 2025.

- i) A member of the public reported to the clerk that a main road drain on the High Street, Carlton was raised and considered dangerous. This was reported to NYC Highways on 21st October 2025, who added it to their inspection list, noted as urgent. A check will be completed to ensure this was corrected.
- ii) A Carlton resident contacted the clerk to ask for assistance as they had been constantly hounded by a group of three youths who were knocking on the front door each night causing upset and concern for their safety. This had been happening regularly for at least two weeks. The clerk advised for the resident to report this to 101 Policing, and the Community Policing group were contacted by the clerk, who asked that the resident contact them directly but did say they would send a patrol car around the area at the time that the events were occurring.
- iii) The pads for both the Surgery and the Village Hall defibrillators were running out of date in October/ November 2025 so have been replaced, at a cost of £300.72 The pads will not need replacing now until 2028 (unless used).
- iv) The Remembrance Sunday service to be held on 9th November 2025 at 11am is to be carried out by the Reverend Mark Poskitt again, with refreshments at the Methodist Church afterwards. The order of service and posters will be issued shortly.
- v) The works to tidy the Golden Garden have been completed before Remembrance Sunday service, with Silica Lodge being engaged to complete the works.
- vi) The Methodist Church have asked the Parish Council if there is a sound system available to assist with the music at their 'Carols Around the Christmas Tree' event on 15th December 2025. The Chair of the Parish Council is to assist with this.
- vii) The NYC debt chasing department emailed to inform of a long term out-standing invoice; the clerk informed them that no visibility of the invoice was seen and requested a copy. This was for streetlight maintenance, and was for £1059.06 – this was paid immediately, and the NY department contacted to inform them as such.
- viii) An email was received from York and North Yorkshire Combined Authority notifying the Council of the availability of £7 million worth of sports and well-being funding. This was issued to the Councillors for their information.
- ix) The Parish Council has received £1089.82 into its current account from Community Infrastructure Levy funds from NYC.
